BEACH CAMPING ON MOABI PENINSULA

The MIGHTY Blackfoot invite you to join us at Park Moabi on the Colorado River near Needles. Our campsites are located in several small coves with perfect sand beaches. Swim and play all day, paddle canoes, and fall asleep to the serenading of coyotes under a canopy of stars. This is one of those trips that YOUR kids will tell THEIR kids about!

WHAT TO DO

Arrive Friday to set up camp, get the beach toys out, and ENJOY the river!

Wake up Saturday morning and get on the water! An optional CANOE trip is available for those who want to experience a true river adventure. Jerkwater Canoe Co. (www.jerkwatercanoe.com) will pick us up at the park at approximately 9:30am and drop us off at the upstream launch site. The trip downstream takes 3 -4 hours and provides ample opportunity for water battles, sprint races, and stops in isolated coves along the way. There are NO rapids! Cost is \$50 per Dad and \$30 per child - including a great box lunch.

Tribes with Boats, Wave Runners, Inner Tubes, Wake boards, etc. will have plenty of opportunity for fun on the river. Consider a cruise down through Topock Gorge into the striking canyons of the Havasu National Wildlife Refuge. You can check out boat rentals at http://www.piratecoveresort.com/boat_rentals.php A 20 foot boat that seats 8 runs about \$260 per day. Rentals are also available at www.topockrentals.com, the marina, or other local vendors in Bullhead City and Lake Havasu.

Sunday morning affords one last chance for some water fun before heading home.

WHAT TO BRING

Bring your tent, sleeping bags, pillows, flashlights/lanterns, swimsuits, towels, SUNSCREEN, hats, sunglasses, beach chairs, sand toys, WATER GUNS, rafts, inner tubes, snacks, and PLENTY of water. The water can be cool (60 degrees) so consider wet suits. The bugs only come out for a short time at dusk, but bring bug repellent and/or wear long sleeves. Saturday night DINNER is included in the registration fee, so you'll only need to worry about breakfasts and lunches.

The campsites have potable water and charcoal bbq grills. The park has a marina, general store, and showers.

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GETTING THERE

Park Moabi is approximately 270 miles from Irvine. It should take between 4 and 5 hours depending on traffic... Hook up with some buddies and car pool - the drive will pass in no time!

DRIVING DIRECTIONS TO PARK MOABI RD, NEEDLES, CA 92363

1. Take CA-91 East for 10 miles
2. Merge to the I-15 North towards BARSTOW
3. Continue North on I-15 for 86 miles
4. At BARSTOW, take I-40 East towards NEEDLES for 147 miles
5. Continue on I-40 past NEEDLES for about 11 miles
6. Turn LEFT on Park Moabi Drive and look for the park entrance on the LEFT



Get your PARKING PASS at the entrance station. Drive past the marina and turn RIGHT on Anchor Lane. Turn LEFT on Peninsula Way and follow to the peninsula campsites. Sites will be assigned one week prior to the trip based on final head count. We will combine brother/sister tribes into common camps wherever possible.
